Editorial

One thing is for certain, there has been more than enough stressful situations. No, there is definitely nothing to complain about; and we are not going to encourage indulging in this feeling, which is but a harmful anomaly in the evolutionary development of the human brain. On the contrary, welfare, achieved at the cost of arduous labour, sleepless nights and frayed nerves, has a value much higher than nominal. However, this will not concern achievement. Symbiosis – more likely.

Let us express the assumption that Newton's first law can, to a certain extent, be transposed to the behavioural aspirations of people. Indeed, it is rather convenient to observe the transpiring chaos in the world around, having nestled in a comfortable position, enriching the Encyclopaedia of Couch Expertise every once in a while. A considerable part of the workers who accidentally slid into the sphere are so passionate about maintaining their inertial movement or state of rest that they do not even try looking at the problematique a little more broadly. Thus, not everyone is fortunate to "witness as much beauty as a one Ali Baba, Kasym's brother, could not have dreamt of when he raided one little-known cave in hopes of buying some rice" (Runner's Gospel, 2009).

Some other part – albeit more active – but blinded by counting only incoming numbers, forgets to include in their formulas the variable of real and potential risks. We shall not dwell on them in detail and spoil everything, but

From a certain perspective, ambitious drivers of every movement and the creators of problems on their own and others' costs are (or may be) almost a necessary component of further progress, the search and invention of new forms of doing business and... protection from themselves. Admittedly, curiosity in itself is not a self-sufficient substance for this (Pylypenko, 2019), regardless of what Vladimir Surdin or Neil deGrasse Tyson may say about this. The authors are struggling to solve their own (even personal) issues, and they are not to blame considering the conditions in which they were placed.
